



My School Day

Quick Start for Students and Parents

Fall 2024

1. Download the app

You can find the app - it's free to download! - on the App Store (IOS) or Google Play (Androld) by

- · Searching in the store for "My School Day"
- Going to https://myschooldav.app/download in the browser on your phone
- Using the QR code at right.





Make sure to allow it to receive notifications when asked - the school will use them to send out important reminders, information and alerts.

2. Select your school

The first time you start the app you will need to select your school. Choose a province, school district, and finally your school from the lists provided, and tap "confirm". This only needs to be done once.

Follow channels.

Channels let the school administration and teachers send out information specific to your classes and activities, so you get only those notifications for your classes and those of interest to the entire school. To subscribe to channels:

- · Tap on the "Classes" Icon
- · Tap "Follow Channels" in the menu
- Tap the checkboxes for the channels you are interested in
- Tap on the "Done" button.

Remember to check back regularly for new channels that your teachers may have added.



4. Enter your classes

Tapping on the classes icon also gives you an option to set up your timetable. Select that option and enter your class names and select colours and icons. You can also enter morning, lunch, and after school activities. When you tap on "Done", the app will fill in your timetable.

Access school information, links and files

The school and teachers will add links and files that provide resources to the school community such as course materials for remote learning, health advisories, and other school, district, and provincial Information. To access these school-wide and channel-specific resources:

You Are God's Beloved

On Sunday, January 12th, the Church celebrated the Baptism of our Lord.

We reflect on Jesus being baptized by John in the river Jordan, remembering God's words: "This is my Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

Are able to hear those words spoken to you? That Jesus sees you as beloved.

The definition of beloved is "to be dearly loved". It's not simply something about us—it's our identity. There's nothing we've done to earn it. Beloved is who we are. And yet, how many of us live our lives out of that truth?

The hurts of life, and sometimes our own mistakes can make us feel it is impossible that Jesus really loves you. This is a danger for all of us. And so sad, because it is completely opposite of what Jesus is really wanting, waiting to tell you.

Our deepest identity isn't based on our accomplishments or failings, what people think about us, or how we view ourselves in the mirror. Rather, it is that we are beloved children of a God who loves us unconditionally. He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy. Even if you are not accepted by others, even by yourself sometimes. He is the one who always accepts you.
