### One child's story

Between the late 1800s and 1996, the federal government forced many First Nations, Inuit, and Métis children to attend Residential Schools.

They had to leave the warmth of their families and live at the cold, overcrowded schools. In many cases, children and parents did not see each other for years. Students were treated poorly. Many were abused. This went on for generations. Phyllis Webstad was one of these children. Excited for the first day of school, Phyllis' grandmother bought her an orange shirt. When she arrived at school, this gift was taken from her and it is a moment she has always remembered.

September 30 was chosen as the date for Orange Shirt Day because September is when Indigenous children were taken from their families to attend Residential Schools. The day honours the tens of thousands of Residential School Survivors.

Today, Phyllis' orange shirt symbolizes what Indigenous students, families, and communities lost because of Residential Schools. The losses include time with family. Parental care. A sense of self-worth and well-being. Language and culture. Freedom. When people choose to wear an orange shirt on Orange Shirt Day, they are sending the message that "every child matters."





### My School Day

**Quick Start for Students** and Parents

You can find the app - it's free to download! - on the App Store (IOS) or Google Play (Androld) by

- · Searching in the store for "My School Day"
- Going to https://myschooldav.app/download in the browser on your phone
- Using the QR code at right.





Make sure to allow it to receive notifications when asked - the school will use them to send out important reminders, information and alerts.

### 2. Select your school

The first time you start the app you will need to select your school. Choose a province, school district, and finally your school from the lists provided, and tap "confirm". This only needs to be done once.

#### Follow channels.

Channels let the school administration and teachers send out information specific to your classes and activities, so you get only those notifications for your classes and those of interest to the entire school. To subscribe to channels:

- · Tap on the "Classes" Icon
- · Tap "Follow Channels" in the menu
- Tap the checkboxes for the channels you are interested in
- Tap on the "Done" button.

Remember to check back regularly for new channels that your teachers may have added.



#### 4. Enter your classes

Tapping on the classes icon also gives you an option to set up your timetable. Select that option and enter your class names and select colours and icons. You can also enter morning, lunch, and after school activities. When you tap on "Done", the app will fill in your timetable.

#### Access school information, links and files

The school and teachers will add links and files that provide resources to the school community such as course materials for remote learning, health advisories, and other school, district, and provincial Information. To access these school-wide and channel-specific resources:

Tap the Info icon at the right hand side of the tab bar:

Remember to check back regularly for new resources that your teachers may have added.




